BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Mary Brown Chase Slade , (1871-1966) was born in West Newbury, MA, the daughter of Elwood Norton and Anna (Noyes) Chase. A graduate of Newbury High School, she studied music at Smith College for a year (1887-1888) and then studied violin in Boston. In 1891, she married Rev. William Slade, a native of Thetford. After serving churches in Massachusetts and Connecticut, the Slades returned to Thetford in 1907, and Mr. Slade served as pastor in North Thetford (1907-1912), and Thetford Hill, and as principal of Thetford Academy (1912-1917). From 1917 to 1922, the Slades lived in Atlanta, returning to Thetford in 1922.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Slade became much interested in the history of Thetford and its Academy, and devoted much of the rest of their lives to studying their history. They discovered the Town Charter and Joseph Steward's portrait of Rev. Asa Burton. An indefatigable worker in the days before copiers and computers, Mrs. Slade read widely and deeply, copying documents and other sources in meticulous writing. She was so thorough, in fact, that she did not finish writing down what she knew. Her main published work was *Thetford Academy's First Century 1819 - 1919* (1956). She also wrote school articles in the *Vermont* magazine and other periodicals.
