SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection consists of 2 boxes containing materials belonging to the Worcester family of Thetford.

HISTORICAL SKETCH

The Worcester family moved to Thetford from Chelsea, Vermont when Ezra C. Worcester made his home here in 1846. Ezra Carter Worcester, MD was born in 1816, in Peacham, VT. He married Ellen Hunt of Charlestown, NH in 1836. Ezra received a Medical degree from Dartmouth College in 1838, and practiced medicine in St. Johnsbury, Chelsea, and Thetford, where he died in 1887.

William Leonard Worcester (1845-1901) was the son of Ezra and Ellen, the eldest of eight children. William received a Bachelor's Degree from Dartmouth College and a Medical Degree from Columbia Medical College. Returning from advanced study abroad, he practiced for a time in Burlington, VT before devoting himself to the study and treatment of mental disorders. Dr. Worcester published many articles and pamphlets, most of which are included in this collection. Dr. Worcester never married, and died in Danvers, MA in 1901, following a battle with Tuberculosis.

George Steele Worcester (1849-1939) was another son of Ezra and Ellen. He was born in Thetford in 1849, and married Ida Kinney of Plainfield, VT in 1881. Relocated to The Philipines from 1908 to 1913. Was active in the community, serving as a Thetford Academy Trustee, was licensed to preach in the Congregational Church. Also served in the State Legislature.

Philip George (P.G.) Worcester was the son of George and Ida, born in Thetford in 1884. He married Mollie Brown in 1910, and was a Professor of Geology at the University of Colorado. Several of his publications relating to Colorado Geology are included in this collection.

William Ezra Worcester (1887-1981) was the brother of P.G. Worcester, also born in Thetford. In 1911, he married Mabel Bullis of Michigan. Worcester was VP of Sales of Kinney manufacturing of Boston, a member of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, and a Thetford Academy Trustee. Mr. Worcester developed a method for pumping liquid asphalt, which revolutionized road resurfacing. He retired to his home in Thetford.
